1. Call to Order

No meeting was called to order or business conducted on May 19, 2012 at 7:30 a.m. at the Watertown Street Department, 811 S. First Street, Watertown, WI

5. Clean Sweep Event Operation

The Veolia Project Manager, Mark Heal conducted a safety meeting for all Committee members, staff, and volunteers at 7:30 a.m. He explained the safety procedures that need to be followed at a Clean Sweep event. After he was done, Sharon explained the jobs to the volunteers and Committee members. Sharon then assigned the various Clean Sweep jobs.

At 7:45 everything was in place and we started putting cars through the Clean Sweep. At this time we already had two cars in line.

The results of our Clean Sweep event:

93 Participants: 85 household, 7 farms – 4 crop and 3 hobby, and 1 VSQG businesses

83 Appointments: 8 No shows/cancels and 18 drive-in without appointment

Four survey questions were asked with these results:

1. Have you used this service before? 39 Yes and 54 No
2. Did you bring chemicals, drugs, or drugs only? 64 chemicals, 2 drugs only & 27 both
3. Do you know about the three electronic recycling sites? 70 Yes and 23 No
4. Do you know about the three drug collection sites? 66 Yes and 27 No

We had 69 residents from the City of Watertown, 4-Town of Watertown, 2-Village of Clyman, 1-Town of Clyman, and 17 residents from all other areas of Jefferson County.

We had a farm from Walworth County and household from the City of Whitewater. Whitewater will be billed for two. Farm was Don Peyer, N9141 Big Spring Drive, Whitewater, WI 53190 and the household was Colleen Reddy, 370 S. Cottage Street, Whitewater, WI 53190

Carol Q. sent two people from the City Health Department. We also had three pharmacists and Sgt. Randy Johnson as our police coverage.
