

# Quick Response (QR) Codes

## Definition

- 2-dimensional barcode that allows for content to be decoded at a high speed
- Scannable by smartphones, iPads, and android tablets for quick access to information (i.e. webpage or contact information)



## How do they work?

- QR codes can be generated for free
- A mobile device owner must have a barcode reader on their phone or tablet to scan the QR code (ie Barcode Scanner for Android, i-Nigma for I-Phone, or QR Scanner Pro for Blackberry are just some of the recommended options out there)
- After a QR code is created, anyone with a barcode reader is able to scan the code and instantly receive the content for the code.

## How can we use them?

- Instantly bring users to our Facebook page
- Help connect users to content on our website
- Users can scan and retrieve contact information to their phone
- Bringing people to survey/feedback pages that would be on our website
- Other agencies have used for: parks information, social media links, & printed on bills to navigate users to online bill payment/lookup

## Cost & Value



- Low cost to implement on flyers/printed media we are already doing. Zero cost to create the codes. Cost would be a factor to consider in creating more permanent fixtures with the codes. (i.e. if we wanted to use in the parks, we would want to consider options for creating a more permanent fixtures that would be weather/tamper resistant)
- Great value in making already existing website/Facebook pages more easily accessible on the go, while having limited to no cost.

## Example

  - Time is saved in scanning a code to the website as opposed to typing it in.

## Things to consider

- Users do need to have a scanner installed to use
- Minimum size is recommended to be 1 inch by 1 inch
- What we link to has to be current and user friendly
- Low Cost/No Cost to add to print materials we are already creating
- More and more people are using smartphones (some are already installed with code readers), making this an easier way to navigate to our information

## ORDINANCE NO. 2011-11

### Create new supervisory district boundaries

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF JEFFERSON COUNTY, IN REGULAR SESSION THIS 13TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER 2011, DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

(1) That Jefferson County be divided into 30 supervisory districts for purposes of electing the County Board.

(a) The Land Information Office shall notify the County Clerk when an annexation or detachment is recorded.

(b) By November 15 of each odd numbered year, the County Board shall review annexations and detachments that have occurred since its last review, and make such adjustments to district boundaries as may be appropriate for purposes of election administration.

(c) The Land Information Office shall maintain up-to-date maps of the districts as they may be amended from time to time.

(2) That one supervisor be elected from each district, commencing with the spring election in 2012.

(3) That said 30 supervisory districts be comprised as follows:
